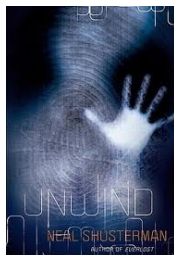

Neal Shusterman's *Unwind*

Neal Shusterman scores another hit with his incredibly popular book **Unwind!** In this futuristic society children cannot be aborted...until they reach the age of 13. From ages 13 to 18, parents or guardians may choose to retroactively abort (unwind) their children.



Shusterman continues his tradition of creating amazing characters. You will find yourself thinking about these people long after the book has ended. I have read this book several times to my students, and they literally beg me to continue reading, even after the last bell has rung. If you are looking for a gripping thriller that will have you biting your nails and pondering the future, read **Unwind** by Neal Shusterman.

Introducing Dr. Judith Irvin



Dr. Irvin defines *literate adolescents* as “those who can read, write, find, discuss, present, think creatively, critically analyze information, and transfer their learning across multiple contexts.” She advocates that “students need to receive quality content literacy instruction as part of their learning experiences in all of their classes, not just in remedial classes or in English language arts or reading classes.” Irvin articulates “practical suggestions, approaches and tools to engage everyone, including adolescents, themselves, in focusing on improving student reading, writing, and thinking, thus preparing students to meet the literary demands of college, careers, and citizenship in the 21st century successfully.”
